Brief Description of cultural element	
The <i>shababa</i> is about 50 cm long. It has six holes along its length and it is made from metal. It is held to the mouth and blown into while your fingers are placed on the holes. The movement of your fingers along with blowing air into the instrument will generate the music. It is usually played at weddings and celebrations.	
Material objects associated with the element	
The <i>shababa</i> is a wind pipe musical instrument.
